These gatherings serve as a pivotal moment for Commissioners to connect, share insights, and foster partnerships with AmeriCorps programs statewide. It's a dynamic space where ideas flourish, strategies are refined, and collective learning propels

AmeriCorps programs, Teach for America- Louisiana and the Boys and Girls Club of Acadiana spoke about the incredible impact their AmeriCorps members are having in Louisiana.



AMERICORPS

Recently, AmeriCorps announced its FY24 support for three National Competitive applicants in the Volunteer Louisiana Commission's portfolio. Grant funding for the three AmeriCorps Louisiana programs totaled \$3,128,000, including awards for:

- City Year Baton Rouge, which received a \$1,700,000 grant to support 71 AmeriCorps members serving to provide full-day education services and social-emotional mentoring to 750 students in Baton Rouge schools
- City Year New Orleans, which received a \$1,200,000 grant to support 48 AmeriCorps members serving to provide full-day education services and social-emotional mentoring for 390 students in New Orleans schools; and,
- Up2Us Sports Coach AmeriCorps program, which received a \$228,000 grant to support 16 AmeriCorps members serving as coach-mentors providing sports-based youth development for 900 economically-disadvantaged young people in New Orleans

AmeriCorps members in these three programs will participate in national service and role-specific training, earn a living allowance, and receive professional development training while serving their program participants and communities in the 2024-25 year. Upon successful completion of their service terms, each of these 135 AmeriCorps members will be eligible for a Segal AmeriCorps Education Award from the National Service Trust totaling a collective \$925,262.

"We celebrate AmeriCorps' ongoing support of these three National Competitive grant programs. Their AmeriCorps members will continue to serve in unique roles that address unmet needs of program participants and that strengthen Louisiana communities" stated Jacob Brumfield, Volunteer Louisiana's Director of National Service. "We celebrate the members' initiative to 'get things done for America.' We know that these service experiences and professional development opportunities will enrich their career preparation."
