The senior center Jane volunteers at hosted a weekly bingo before the pandemic and it was attended by a large group of dedicated seniors. The event was an important way for seniors to socialize and was unfortunately brought to an abrupt halt.

Jane knew firsthand that the loss of the event coupled with limitations on family visitors was a huge disappointment to the seniors who used the center. She brought an idea to the senior center leadership to host a safe outdoor bingo night with proper protocols in place to allow Bingo Night to happen in a COVID-19 environment. Jane worked tirelessly to produce an outdoor bingo event by partnering with the senior center, local government, and local businesses. She was driven by her passion for seeing the seniors safely enjoy a normal activity to combat the negative effects of complete isolation.

Deterring isolation for seniors has been a critical need throughout these two years as several waves have made contact unsafe time and time again. Outdoor Bingo has been a terrific way to combat this and continue to serve a vulnerable group. If it wasn't for Jane taking on this initiative the event could not have taken place. The staff of the senior center had been tasked with numerous new pandemic-related duties during this time, therefore Jane's volunteer leadership was critical to executing an important extracurricular for the senior community.
